2012 Speakers

Dr. Jim Dunn

Dr. James W. Dunn is a professor of Agricultural Economics at The Pennsylvania State University. Jim has been at Penn State since 1977, doing teaching, research, and extension in the areas of agricultural marketing, agricultural policy, food industry economics and trade. In addition to teaching about the Economics of the Food System and Marketing Decisions, most of his time is focused in dairy marketing, agricultural markets and price risk management. He is also the undergraduate coordinator for the Agribusiness Management Program. Growing up in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, Jim earned his Ph.D. in Agricultural Economics at Oklahoma University, and previous degrees from South Dakota State University. He has worked in

Ireland, Mexico, Australia, Namibia, and 12 of the newly independent states in Eastern and Central Europe. He spent the latter half of 1995 as a Congressional Fellow working on the Farm Bill out of Senator Rick Santorum's office. Jim will be providing an outlook for grain, livestock markets for 2012, a look at trends affecting our bullish export markets and will comment about the agricultural and general economy during this election year.

David Swartz

Dave is a senior dairy educator with Penn State Extension. He also serves as county extension director for Perry and Cumberland Counties. Dave has provided an insightful dairy market outlook at each of the past Ag Outlook Meetings. In this year's presentation, Dave will look closely at the export market, since it has been so important to milk prices over the past 18 months. You won't want to miss this informative and common sense presentation about milk markets.

Paul Hostetter

Paul graduated from The Pennsylvania State University in May 2006 with a major in Animal Science with minors in Agri-Business Management and Poultry & Avian Science. After graduation, Paul worked for several years as a Production Supervisor in an egg processing facility for Cargill in Lake Odessa, Michigan, and later for an egg production facility in Rembrandt, Iowa. Paul's current duties include working with the PennAg Poultry Council, Feed Grain and Allied Industry Council, and the PennAg Transportation Committee. Paul will be providing an outlook for the egg, broiler and hog industry in Pennsylvania and the nation, as well as trends that will be impacting producers in those areas.

Donna Myers

Donna owns and operates a 300 acre dairy farm, Windsor Manor Farm, with her husband Jason, in New Windsor, Maryland. Donna and Jason milk 44 registered Holsteins with their daughter Kelly Zepp. The farm has bred All-Americans in Holsteins, Red & White Holsteins and nominated Brown Swiss. Donna and Jason bred the #1 TPI bull in 2002, Windsor Manor Machoman. They have sold embryos to numerous countries and continents. Donna served as President of the Maryland Holstein Association, President of the Maryland Agricultural Council, Chairman of the Carroll County Fair, served as Director of the Maryland State Fair, and Superintendent of the MD State Fair 4-H Dairy show. Donna has coached many 4-H dairy judging teams, both locally and for the state of Maryland. In October at the 2011 World Dairy Expo, in Madison, Wisconsin, Donna was recognized for her leadership in the dairy industry by the presentation of the Dairy Woman of the Year award. This prestigious national award recognizes women who have been influential in the dairy industry. Donna and Jason have two daughters and four grandchildren. During her presentation, Donna will share the goals and priorities that she and Jason have had as a farm family. She will discuss their view of the registered cow business and their strategies to develop great cows. Donna will also discuss both the good times and the times of trial that they have experienced during many years in agriculture. With so much experience with organizations in leadership positions, Donna will discuss her practical view of working with people.
